## Alabama Alpha Mourns the Loss of Special Friend

en Bittner, a very special friend to the Alabama Alpha Chapter, died on April 6, 2007. Most of you did not know him, but he was very instrumental in the success of our Chapter over the past four years. He was one of the original contractors who worked on our initial renovation beginning in 2003.

Soon afterward, he was diagnosed with leukemia. After an exhausting round of treatments he went into remission. He then closed his construction business and semi-retired, making the maintenance of the Phi Psi house his only work. He was responsible for all of the improvements we have enjoyed, as well as maintenance, until his leukemia returned in the summer of 2006 during the Ramsey Room project.

After another round of treatments, Ken experienced intermittent periods of good health and illness. Through all of his health problems, he worked at the Phi Psi house when he could and kept in touch. Ken was always concerned about the house and the boys— even during the worst of his fight against this terrible disease.

Ken was an incredible craftsman and a wonderful person. He did not need to work, but he did things for Alabama Alpha because he wanted to. He will be sorely missed by all of us.

## Phi Psi Alumnus Returns Home from Capitol Hill

#### ~ Alumnus Spotlight—Jeff Emerson '88 ~

journalism and political science, Jeff Emerson '88 has spent his career in politics. Most of that career was spent in Washington, D.C., where he worked for two different congressmen and as a consultant.

His first stop in Washington was on the staff of Congressman Buddy Darden of Georgia where Jeff

was press secretary. During that time, he met his future wife, Whitney, at an event in Washington and proposed four months later. They were in the middle of planning their wedding when Jeff's boss was defeated for re-election, so Jeff left Capitol Hill and went to work with the political consulting firm of Odell, Roper, and Simms. There he handled a diverse group of political clients, including the National Republican Senatorial Committee and the Progressive Conservative Party of Canada.

Jeff went back to work on Capitol Hill two years later as press secretary and then chief of staff for Congressman Spencer Bachus of Alabama. He remained with Congressman Bachus's office for six years, traveling between Alabama and Washington often. The time spent back in Alabama, plus the arrival of the Emersons' first child, made Jeff long for a return to the state. In 2002, the Emersons moved to Shelby County where Jeff continued working for Congressman Bachus's office in Birmingham. A few months later, he became deputy director of the Alabama Association of Realtors and lobbied the state legislature for the organization.

Jeff was contacted near the end of 2003 and asked if he would consider joining Governor Riley's cabinet as communicators director. A huge supporter of Governor Riley, Jeff immediately jumped at the chance and has steered the Governor's strategic communications planning, media relations, and speech writing.

Today, Jeff and Whitney reside outside Montgomery,

Alabama, in Millbrook and are the parents of 8-year-old Wyatt and 5-year-old Anastasia, both of whom they adopted from Russia.

Jeff says one of the best things about coming back to Alabama was that the change made it easier to rekindle friendships with several brothers at Phi Kappa Psi. Being closer to UA has also given Jeff the chance to take both his children to several home football games.

"I was so happy I literally had tears in my eyes the first time I got to take my children to an Alabama football game. My son was wearing his Bama jersey, my daughter was dressed as a Bama cheerleader, and they were in awe of the immensity of the occasion. The stadium, the crowd, the music, the Quad, the game itself—you don't get that up in Washington, D.C., or really anywhere else.
